## 8. Right Trax opportunity

Right Trax is looking for people with a passion for motor bikes, cars and motor mechanics who want to gain team building and employability skills.

Youth Promise Plus is offering an opportunity to gain a qualification in level 1 employability with Right Trax.

## 9. Council tax Reduction

The council provides a local discount for its care leavers to reduce their council tax bills to zero until they reach their 25th birthday.

If you are a Birmingham care leaver, you still need to apply for any other reduction to which you are entitled such as;

- Student discount or exemption
- Single resident discount
- Council tax support (CTS)

The discount does not apply if;

- The bill is in someone else's name (for instance a friend, relative or landlord)
- You are a care leaver living outside Birmingham

#### It does still apply if;

- You are jointly liable for council tax with someone who is not a care leaver, or
- You would be named on the bill if you were not a student.



## 11. The Local Offer

The 18+ Care Leavers Service is here to help young people make the move from living in care to enjoying independent life as an adult. We support young people from age 18 to 21, and this can continue up to the age of 25 if you wish.

We understand that leaving care is a time of big changes in your life, and you will have lots of questions about the support you can get and the services available to you.

These questions are so important that the government asked every local authority to produce its own Local Offer including all of the services and information that care leavers would need. The Local Offer was produced with the support of the care leavers' forum.

The food and beverage assistants start on zero-hours contracts however, there are lots of permeant contracts for reliable people (8 hours, 16 hours and 24 hours pw). Progression from Food and beverage assistant can be to the restaurant, bar, kitchen reception and sales.
