My Foster Carer is:


They look after me and speak up for me. They have been chosen to look after children like me who can't live at home with their family.

When will I see my family?

Just because you live in a foster home doesn't mean that you have to lose touch with your family. Your Foster Carer and Social Worker will speak with you about this.

How long will I have to stay?

Your Social Worker will plan for you. This is called your 'Care Plan' and tells you and everyone close to you what is going to happen to you. Your Social Worker and other people who care for you will ask you what you think should be in your plan.
