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Trust property update September 2023

With the Council's closure of Lancaster Circus Trust colleagues have been incredibly busy preparing for some significant office moves that will be taking place very soon.

As Trust staff leave Lancaster Circus in the city centre in October, a new office, 'One Avenue Road' in Aston Cross, will be ready to be occupied.

Elsewhere, the existing Lifford House offices, situated in the south of the city, are nearing the end of a refurbishment programme.

Staff have been kept up to date through a series of email newsletters and short video clips.

Welcoming our new Chief Executive

After a national recruitment search,

James Thomas, currently Director of
Children's Services in Tower Hamlets, has
been appointed Chief Executive of Birmingham Children's Trust, replacing
Andy Couldrick who is retiring as Chief
Executive and taking on the role of Chair
of Birmingham Children's Trust Board.

James is an experienced Director with a strong track record leading children's services in a number of different local authorities.

Andy Couldrick, current Chief Executive said:

"After a rigorous search, and from a strong field, I am delighted that James was successful.

"He was an outstanding candidate, and he has clear experience of delivering change and improvement in children's services in different and complex environments and I have no doubt he will take Birmingham Children's Trust on to further success.

"I look forward to working with him in my new role as Chair of the Trust Board."

"I was pleased to be part of the panel that interviewed James. UPDATE - SEPTEMBER 2023

We are delighted to announce that the Birmingham Safeguarding Children Partnership will be introducing a safeguarding newsletter on a quarterly basis, launching at the end of September. Our newsletter will contain a wealth of information on safeguarding, including updated policies and procedures, available training courses, and other relevant news. Additionally, we will be highlighting the work of Birmingham practitioners in our 'Practitioner Spotlight' feature, where we will be conducting video interviews with a different person in each edition about their experiences and roles in safeguarding children. Our first practitioner will be Dr Yasmin Husain, who is the Named GP for NHS Birmingham and Solihull ICB Safeguarding Team.

Our newsletter launch date is set for September 27, which coincides with our upcoming Practitioners' Forum. During these meetings, we have the chance to connect with front-line practitioners and gain insights into their experiences. We welcome feedback on what is working well, what challenges they face, and what support they need. Additionally, we explore new developments and improvements in children's safeguarding. Our upcoming Practitioners' Forum will focus on important news and updates, including a review of safeguarding arrangements during last year's Commonwealth Games, the appointment of the new Chief Executive at Birmingham Children's Trust, and the significance of ICON Week 2023, including its role in promoting awareness of the consequences of shaking babies and how best to help parents cope with infant crying.

Summer memories and milestones

Bfriends Charity in partnership with Birmingham Children's Trust delivered a range of summer events for young people and families known to the Trust, making memories, and creating new opportunities including the largest day trip to date.

Young people enjoyed a football camp designed and delivered by the Trust's apprenticeship team who have worked hard within the last two years to continue this important offer.

Over 150 young people took to the water taking part on canoeing and other water sports whilst others took part in life skills, and cooking sessions were delivered in partnership with Digbeth Dinning Club, 2MuchPassion, and Blesst, where young people got to try different cooking skills and spend time together.

300 young people, siblings, parents, and carers ended the summer programmes with a trip to Blackpool including spending time on the beach, in the pleasure beach and importantly making memories. Young people and adults from across the Trust's participation groups and forums ended their summer events with a sports and celebration event at The Red Shed community centre. It was a sunny day spent outside together. They were joined by several partners and took part in a range of sporting and team activities.

Trust activities roundup

Trust staff have been busy supporting children, young people and families across the city this Autumn.

Lots of activities are planned to develop the knowledge base and skills of Trust staff, including:

- Domestic Abuse training Working with Richmond Fellowship a series of online and face-to-face events are taking place right up to April 2023. Topics will include 'gaslighting', 'stalking' and 'holding safe conversations'.
- Black History Month During October the Trust will host online guest speakers and deliver 'lunch and learn' sessions to cover a range of topics.
- FGM awareness campaign Alongside
 Birmingham Safeguarding Children
 Partnership the Trust is raising awareness of
 FGM by working with a survivor to produce
 social media videos and online content.
- Continuing to make 'Connections Count' The Trust has it's own way of delivering
 children's social care practice, called
 'Connections Count'. This is the name of our
 relationship-based practice model. Training
 on the model continues to be delivered to
 social work teams to develop knowledge.



ARE YOU LOOKING AFTER SOMEONE ELSE'S CHILD?



If you have been caring for someone else's child for over 28 days, and you are NOT a close relative (such as a grandparent, uncle or aunt, brother or sister, or step-parent by marriage) this is called 'Private Fostering'.

Here at Birmingham Children's Trust we need to be made aware of these arrangements. We are here to help you, and any children you are caring for.
